POWER SUPPLY

CAUTION: Risk of electric shock. Do not open.

This appliance is supplied with a moulded 3 pin mains plug for your safety. The value of the fuse fitted is marked on the pin face of the plug. Should the fuse need replacing, ensure the substitute is of the correct rating, approved to BS1362 and ASTA or BS Kite marked.







The fuse cover is removable with a small plain slot screwdriver. Ensure the fuse cover is replaced before attempting to connect the plug to an electrical outlet. If the cover is missing, a replacement must be obtained or the plug replaced with a suitable type.

If a replacement plug is to be fitted this must be carried out by a qualified electrician.

The damaged or incomplete plug, when cut from the cable shall be disabled to prevent connection to a live electrical outlet.

This appliance is Class II † and is designed for connection to a power supply matching that detailed on the rating label and compatible with the plug fitted.

If an extension lead is required, use an approved and compatible lead rated for this appliance. Follow all the instruction supplied with the extension lead.

[†]Double insulated □: This product requires no earth connection as supplementary insulation is applied to the basic insulation to protect against electric shock in the event of failure of the basic insulation.

IMPORTANT:

On products exceeding 2000W it is recommended that the power cable and/or extension cable are fully unwound before a connection is made to the power supply. However, ensure the residual cable does not pose a trip hazard



GENERAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING: When using electric tools basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and personal injury including the following.

Read all these instructions before attempting to operate this product and save these instructions.

SAFE OPERATION

1. KEEP WORK AREA CLEAR

Cluttered areas and benches invites injuries.

2. CONSIDER WORK AREA ENVIRONMENT

- Do not expose tools to rain.
- Do not use tools in damp or wet locations.
- Keep work area well lit.
- Do not use tools in the presence of flammable liquids or gases.

3. GUARD AGAINST ELECTRIC SHOCK

 Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces (e.g. pipes, radiators, ranges, refrigerators).

4. KEEP OTHER PERSONS AWAY

 Do not let persons, especially children, not involved in the work touch the tool or the extension cord and keep them away from the work area.

STORE IDLE TOOLS

- When not in use, tool should be stored in a dry locked-up place, out of reach of children.

DO NOT FORCE THE TOOL

 It will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was intended.

7. USE THE RIGHT TOOL

- Do not force tools to do the job of a heavy duty tool.
- Do not use tools for purposes not intended; for example do not use circular saws to cut tree limbs or logs.

DRESS PROPERLY

- Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery, they can be caught in moving parts.
- Non-skid footwear is recommended when working outdoors.
- Wear protective hair covering to contain long hair.

9. USE PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

- Use safety glasses.
- Use face or dust mask if working operations create dust.

10. CONNECT DUST EXTRACTION EQUIPMENT

 If the tool is provided for the connection of dust extraction and collecting equipment, ensure these are connected and properly used.

11. DO NOT ABUSE THE CORD

 Never yank the cord to disconnect it from the socket. Keep the cord away from heat, oil and sharp edges.

12. SECURE WORK

 Where possible use clamps or a vice to hold the work. It is safer than using your hand.

13. DO NOT OVERREACH

Keep proper footing and balance at all times.

14. MAINTAIN TOOLS WITH CARE

- Keep cutting tools sharp and clean for better and safer performance.
- Follow instruction for lubricating and changing accessories.
- Inspect tool cords periodically and if damaged have them repaired by an authorized service facility.
- Inspect extension cords periodically and replace if damaged.
- Keep handles dry, clean and free from oil and grease.

15. DISCONNECT TOOLS

 When not in use, before servicing and when changing accessories such as blades, bits and cutters, disconnect tools from the power supply.

16. REMOVE ADJUSTING KEYS AND WRENCHES

 Form the habit of checking to see that keys and adjusting wrenches are removed from the tool before turning it on.

17. AVOID UNINTENTIONAL STARTING

Ensure switch is in "off" position when plugging in.

18. USE OUTDOOR EXTENSION LEADS

 When the tool is used outdoors, use only extension cords intended for outdoor use and so marked.

19. STAY ALERT

- Watch what you are doing, use common sense and do not operate the tool when you are tired.

20. CHECK DAMAGED PARTS

- Before further use of tool, it should be carefully checked to determine that it will operate properly and perform its intended function.
- Check for alignment of moving parts, binding of moving parts, breakage of parts, mounting and any other conditions that may affect its operation.
- A guard or other part that is damaged should be properly repaired or replaced by an authorized service centre unless otherwise indicated in this instruction manual.
- Have defective switches replaced by an authorized service centre.
- Do not use the tool if the switch does not turn it on and off.

21. WARNING

 The use of any accessory or attachment other than one recommended in this instruction manual may present a risk of personal injury.

22. HAVE YOUR TOOL REPAIRED BY A QUALIFIED PERSON

 This electric tool complies with the relevant safety rules. Repairs should only be carried out by qualified persons using original spare parts, otherwise this may result in considerable danger to the user.



ADDITIONAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING

For your own safety, do not operate your spindle moulder until it is completely assembled and installed according to the instructions....and until you have read and understood the safety rules, assembly procedures, adjustment procedures and maintenance etc.

- 1. STABILITY.
 - There may be a tendency for the spindle moulder to tip over or move during certain cutting operations, such as, working with extremely large heavy panels or long heavy boards.
- 2. MINIMISE POTENTIAL ACCIDENTS. Most accidents are caused by FAILURE TO FOLLOW SET UP AND OPERATION INSTRUCTIONS. Avoid awkward hand positions, where a sudden slip could cause a hand to move into the cutting tool. Never reach behind, or around, the cutting tool with either hand to hold down the workpiece, or for any other reason. DO NOT PLACE FINGERS
- 3. Never reach under or over your machine when operating or make any adjustments when it is running.
- Turn the spindle moulder 'OFF' and disconnect the power supply when changing the cutting tool, or making any adjustments.

OR HANDS IN THE PATH OF THE CUTTING TOOL.

- Always maintain control of the workpiece. DO NOT 'LET GO' of the workpiece until the machine has stopped.
- When removing short workpieces, or cleaning up around the table, be sure the router is switched 'OFF'.
- Never turn the spindle moulder 'ON' before clearing the table of all tools, wood scraps, etc., except the workpiece and related feed or support devices for the operation.
- **8.** When moving the spindle moulder, disconnect power supply.
 - WARNING: Do not allow familiarity (gained from frequent use of your spindle moulder) to become commonplace. Always remember that a careless fraction of a second is sufficient to inflict severe injury.
- MAKE SURE YOUR FINGERS DO NOT CONTACT THE TERMINALS OF THE POWER PLUG when installing or removing from the mains power supply.
- Do not attempt to remove excess material in one pass.
- Always feed against the cutter's direction of rotation.
- 12. Read and understand the instructions supplied with the machine before attempting to use this spindle moulder.
- AVOID KICKBACK. Never stand directly behind the workpiece. Under no circumstances use the mitre guide with the fence, as a dangerous kickback may result.

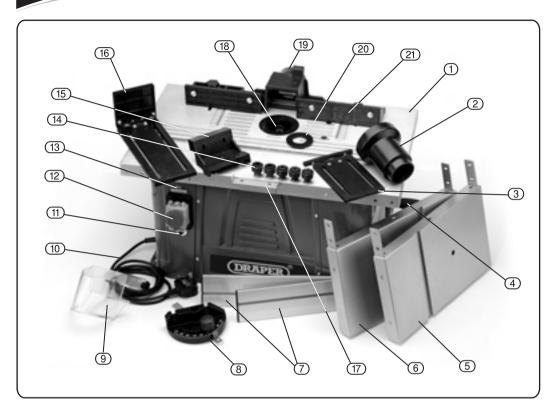
- 14. IF YOUR SPINDLE MOULDER MAKES AN UNFAMILIAR NOISE OR IF IT VIBRATES EXCESSIVELY, CEASE OPERATING IMMEDIATELY UNTIL THE SOURCE HAS BEEN LOCATED AND THE PROBLEM CORRECTED. Sawing wood.
- Do not use High speed steel (HSS) blades;
- The push-stick or push block should always be stored with the machine when not in use.

SAFE OPERATION

- Use push-sticks or push blocks to feed the workpiece past the cutter;
- Use and ensure correct adjustment of the guard is observed.
- Use only cutters for which the maximum possible speed is not less than the maximum spindle speed of the tool and is suitable for the material to be cut.
- When transporting the machine use only transportation devices and never use guards for handling or transportation.

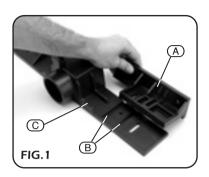
- Work table.
- (2) Dust extraction adaptor.
- (3) Upper workpiece quide.
- 4 Height adjustment handle.

- UNPACKING: After removing the packing material, make sure the product is in perfect condition and that there are no visible damaged parts. If in doubt, do not use the spindle moulder and contact the dealer from whom it was purchased.

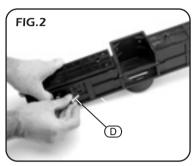

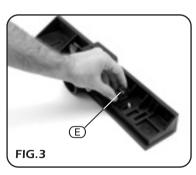
- ASSEMBLY OF REAR MOULDED FENCE (Figs.1 3): Slide the moveable back plate (A) into grooves (B) found on the rear moulded fence (C). Fig.1.



Attach the moveable back plate to the rear moulded fence using bolt (D). Fig.2.

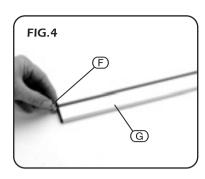


Secure the back plate in place using the plastic nut (E). Fig.3.

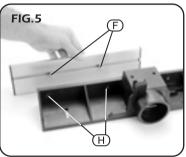




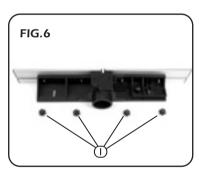
- FITTING THE LEFT & RIGHT REAR FENCE PLATES TO THE REAR MOULDED FENCE (Figs. 4 6):
- Slide x2 securing bolts (F) into both left and right rear fence plates (G). Fig 4.



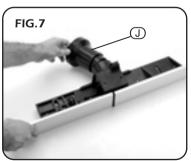
- Locate the securing bolts (F) into the corresponding holes (H) found on the rear moulded fence. Fig.5.



- Secure the rear fence plates to the moulded fence using plastic nuts ①. Fig.6.

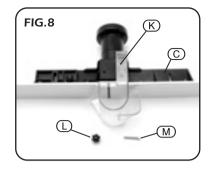


- DUST EXTRACTION (Fig.7):
- Once the rear moulded fence has been assembled, attach the dust extraction adaptor ① if needed.

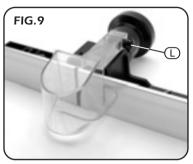




- FITTING THE ROUTER BIT GUARD (Figs. 8 & 9):
- The router bit guard (K) must be used when the upper and lower blade guides are not in use. Plastic securing nut (L) and bolt (M) are required to attach the guard to the rear moulded fence. Fig. 8.



 The router bit guard is attached to the rear moulded fence by feeding the bolt M through the guard and moulded fence locating holes and securing with plastic nut L. Fig. 9.

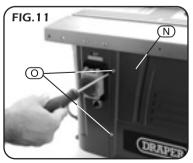


- FIXING THE REAR FENCE TO THE WORK TABLE (Figs. 10 14):
- Place the fully assembled rear moulded fence onto the work table. Fig. 10.



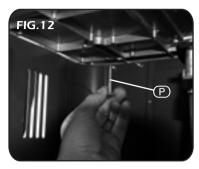
 Remove the front panel (N) by removing the x4 cross slot screws (O) using a cross slotted screwdriver (not supplied). Fig. 1 1.

Note: Ensure spindle moulder is unplugged from the mains power supply.

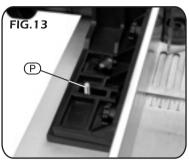




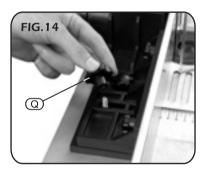
Once the front panel has been removed, insert bolts
 (P) into the rear moulded fence locating holes. The locating holes can be found at the rear of the spindle moulder on the underside of the table top either side of the motor. Fig.12.



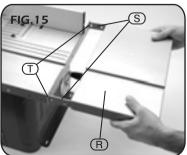
- Each fixing bolt (P) will pass through both the work table and the rear moulded guide fence. Fig.13.



- Fix the rear moulded guide fence to the work table using plastic nut ②. Fig.14.

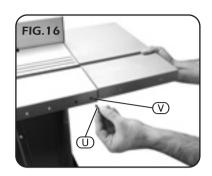


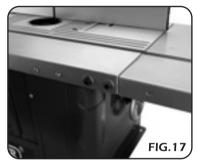
- ATTACHING THE SIDE EXTENSION WINGS (Figs.15 - 17):
- To attach the left and right extension wings (R) slide guides (S) in the corresponding grooves (T). Fig.15.



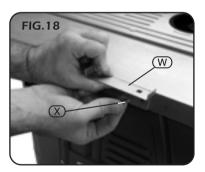


- Holding the extension wings in place using one hand, insert x4 hex bolts (U) through fixing holes (V). Fig.16.
- When fixing the extension wings ensure the use of the correct washers and fixing rings.

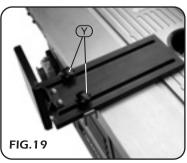




- ASSEMBLY OF THE LOWER PUSH GUIDE (Figs.18 & 19):
- Fix the lower push guide bracket (W) to the table top using x2 cross slot screws (X). Fig. 18.

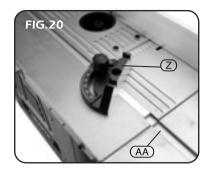


- Attach the lower push guide to the bracket (W) using x2 bolts and plastic nuts (Y). Fig.19.

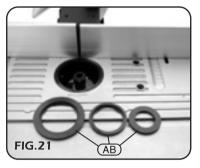




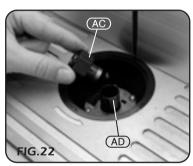
- ATTACHING THE MITRE GUIDE (Fig.20):
- The mitre guide ② is used when the operator wishes to perform angled cuts. The mitre guide simply slides into work table groove (AA). Fig. 20.



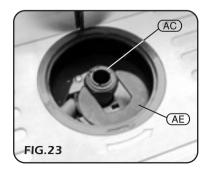
- INSERT PLATES (Fig.21):
- The spindle moulder is supplied with a selection of insert plates (AB). The insert plates are 3 different sizes one plate is to be used dependant on the router bit size. Fig.21.



- ROUTER BIT REDUCING BUSHES (Figs.22 & 23):
- Select the desired reducing bush (AC) and then push and screw down onto threaded spindle (AD). Fig.22.



- Ensure the reducing bush (AC) is fully tightened by using the spanner (AE) supplied. Fig.23.

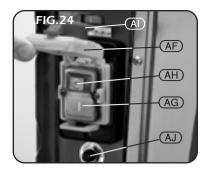

OPERATION AND USE

- SWITCHING SPINDLE MOULDER ON/OFF (Fig.24):
- Lift up protection cover (AF), press switch 'I' (AG) to turn spindle moulder on, or switch 'O' (AH) to turn spindle moulder off.

Note: If spindle moulder needs to be stopped in an emergency, press the red button (A) found on the switch cover. If the emergency button is pressed, reset switch (A) must be pressed before the spindle moulder can be re-started.



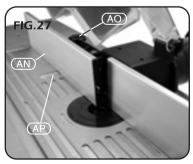
- VARIABLE SPEED (Fig.25):
- The spindle moulder is fitted with a variable speed switch (AK). The switch has 5 speeds detailed by numbers 1 5; `1' being the lowest speed and `5' the highest.



- ROUTER BIT HEIGHT ADJUSTMENT (Fig.26):
- The spindle moulder has a spindle travel of 0 40mm.
 The height can be changed by turning hand wheel
 (AL) left or right depending on whether the router bit height is to be increased or decreased. The height can be measured using measuring scale (AM).



- ADJUSTABLE LEFT FENCE PLATE (Fig.27):
- The left sided rear fence plate (AN) can be adjusted forward and back by loosening locking knobs (AO) and manually sliding the fence plate to the desired position.
 The position of the plate can be determined using measuring scale (AP).

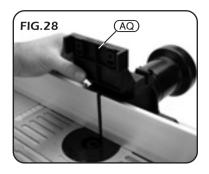




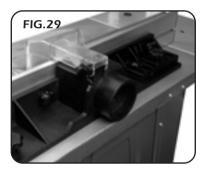

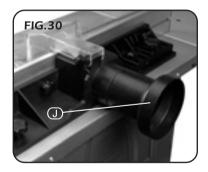
- UPPER WORKPIECE GUIDE (Fig.28):
- In order to use the upper workpiece guide (page 6, part 3) you first need to attach the upper guides support bracket (AQ) to the moulded rear guide.

Note: Before attaching the upper workpiece guide, you must first remove the router bit guard (page 6, part 9).



- DUST EXTRACTION (Figs. 29 & 30):
- The spindle moulder is supplied with a dust extraction adaptor ①. Without the adaptor the hose size is 35mm and when the adaptor is used the hose size is 100mm.







DISPOSAL OF POWER TOOLS

- At the end of the machine's working life, or when it can no longer be repaired, ensure that it is disposed of according to national regulations.
